Our work is underpinned by 15 years of sectorleading student research and our student-led board of trustees. We represent students and understand their attitudes towards sustainability.














What is Green Campus Revolution?





Engagement over the whole academic year

GCR follows a cyclical process over the academic year, ensuring students are engaged both faceto-face and online at key points, from welcome events to the move-out period.

Throughout the year, fun and inclusive engagement activities run alongside student training and communications.



Who is it for?



Green Campus Revolution has run in more than 80 organisations, including large and small universities, and purpose-built student accommodation providers spread across multiple cities.

Whether you work in a sustainability team or a residential services team at a university or in private accommodation, you can partner with SOS-UK to deliver the programme with your students.

You don't need a large residential population to take part! The programme has historically focused on students living in halls of residence, but we also run engagement and skills-building activities for the whole student population.





COSTINGS

SOS-UK is a registered charity, making us an affordable and ethical partner for your sustainability work. Our pricing model covers our time and resources and is notfor-profit.

The cost to run the full programme with your students in 2025-26 is between £7,500 and £13,000 +VAT, depending on the number of students you have and the level of support you require

We also offer several optional extras that you can add to your programme to boost engagement where you need it, outlined on pages 15 and 16.

What is included?

You will have a dedicated Project Manager from SOS-UK to support you with local delivery of the project.

As well as overall project management, the activities and support detailed on the next two pages are included in your fee.



COMMUNICATION AND RESOURCES

- Briefing for relevant staff (such as reception staff, wardens or residential assistants) so they are bought into the programme's aims and activities.
- A series of well-designed student-facing communications including tips, competitions, and quizzes to cover the whole academic year.
- Coordination of ethically sourced prizes for your students.
- Student volunteer recruitment materials.
- Digital badges issued to all student volunteers.
- Access for students and relevant staff to a series of nationally-coordinated webinars.





ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

Your Project Manager will deliver bespoke support activities which can cover, but is not limited to, the below. Your Project Manager will work with you to decide the most effective support for engaging your students.

- Volunteer training session for student ambassadors.
- On-site visits to deliver student-facing engagement, such as a stall at a welcome event, dining hall visits or running an in-person quiz.
- Additional support workshops for student volunteers to co-create interventions for their peers, including processing microgrants to fund their ideas.

REPORTING

- Mid-year summary and review.
- Monitoring & evaluation surveys to quantify behaviour change.
- Full end-of-year report to demonstrate reach, impact and achievements of the programme.



Additional support

Recycling audits

Recycling audits provide a visual check of all bins in shared kitchens to give you a greater understanding on recycling habits and to feedback to students on their performance.

- Communal waste bins are audited by paid trained students (payments at the real living wage are included in the fee).
- Bins are scored to ascertain levels of contamination and record key data.
- Feedback is shared with students on their performance, with high-scoring kitchens receiving Fairtrade chocolate.
- An audit report presents scores, waste trends and key recommendations.

Additional support

Inter-hall energy saving competition

To inspire friendly competition between residences, and motivate additional energy savings, our popular inter-hall competition is a recommended bolt-on to your programme.

If you have sub-metering available, we can analyse this data against a pre-intervention baseline to generate a leaderboard of the top performing residence to help build and mobilise the student community. This could be a competition between halls on the same campus, or in different cities.

We will share a mid-year and end-of-year leaderboard, with student-facing communications, to boost savings and reward students' progress.
